

Lesson Twenty-Three - Worksheet

This lesson coincides with a diary entry dated May 12, 2019 from “Diary of Emotions: Thoughts and Feelings”. The purpose of this lesson is to determine how the author’s mother feels about not receiving something from her.

Entry Date: May 12, 2019

Main Idea and Supporting Details

Place an “X” on the line beside the “main idea” of the story.

Making Predictions

How do you think Geneva is feeling since the money that Grace sent her never arrived?

Identifying Cause and Effect

"I am still feeling discouraged about the cash I sent last month never arriving, so I did not send a Mother's Day card for fear it would not reach her."

What is the Cause? Grace is feeling discouraged about the cash she sent never arriving.

What is the Effect? She did not send a Mother's Day card because she was worried that it would not arrive either.

Character Trait Discussion

The Character Trait for Lesson Twenty-Three is "giving".

Giving means to give something to someone voluntarily without expecting anything in return.

Read the statement below. Then choose one of the questions below and answer it. Write your answer in the space provided then discuss it with your group.

Grace has been very giving to her mother. She provides her mother with the things she wants even though she is not capable of doing anything for her.

1. Are you a giving person? Mention some nice things you have done.
2. It is better to be a giver or a receiver? Explain.
3. Describe something nice that someone has done for you.
